Today's parable of the Prodigal Son forms an exact icon of repentance at its different stages.

Sin is exile, enslavement to strangers, hunger. Repentance is the return from exile to our true home; it is to receive back our inheritance and freedom in the Father's house. But repentance implies action: "I will rise up and go..." To repent is not just to feel regret, but to make a decision and to act on it.

In the words of our Lord, we also learn of three things through this parable: the condition of the sinner, the rule of repentance, and the greatness of God's compassion. The reading of this parable follows the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee so that, seeing in the person of the Prodigal Son our own sinful condition, we might come to our senses and return to God through repentance.

For those who have fallen into great despair over their sins thinking that there is no forgiveness, this parable offers hope. The Heavenly Father is patiently and lovingly waiting for our return. There is no sin that can overcome His love for us.

PRAYER OF DAY: It is me, o Lord, I am the Prodigal Son. Grant me also a true spirit of repentance. Make me your true servant who accepts responsibility for my failings and grant me the courage to face you and say, "Forgive me, for I have sinned".

Grant that by my reception today of your Holy Mysteries, my repentance will be made perfect, and my reconciliation complete.

Troparion, Tone 6: Angelic powers were upon Your tomb* and the guards became like dead men;* Mary stood before Your tomb* seeking Your most pure body.* You captured Hades without being overcome by it.* You met the Virgin and granted life.* O Lord, risen from the dead,* glory be to You!

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion, Tone 3: Foolishly have I fled from Your glory, O Father,* wasting the wealth You gave me on vices.* Therefore, I offer You the words of the Prodigal:* Loving Father, I have sinned before You.* Take me, for I repent, and make me as one of Your hired hands.

Prokeimenon, Tone 6 Save Your people, O Lord, * and bless Your inheritance. *verse:* Unto You I will cry, O Lord, my God, lest You turn from me in silence.

A Reading from the First Epistle of St Paul to the Corinthians (6:12-20): Brethren, 'All things are lawful for me', but I will not be dominated by anything. 'Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food', and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is meant not for fornication but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Should I therefore take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Do you not know that whoever is united to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For it is said, 'The two shall be one flesh.' But anyone united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Shun fornication! Every sin that a person commits is outside the body; but the fornicator sins against the body itself. Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body.



PREPARING FOR THE GREAT LENT

The period of the Great Lent is a special and important phase of the Church's Liturgical Cycle. It is a forty days period set aside for reflection, repentance, prayer and fasting. It is an opportunity for each of us Christians to re-evaluate our relationship with God, our brothers and sisters, and ourselves.

This year Great Lent begins on Monday, March 4th. The Church shares with us Sundays of preparation prior to its start. This is done in order for us not to be overwhelmed with the abrupt changes that will take place during the Lenten Season. This introduction period into The Great Lent is known as Triodion. The Triodion is a large book containing scripture readings and hymns from the period of four weeks before the beginning of Great Lent to the morning service of Holy Saturday.

The scripture lessons the first three weeks of Triodion introduce to us various themes, ideas, and ways in which we can be active participants during the Fast, and experience the Resurrection of Christ with great faith and vigor.

On the first Sunday of Triodion, we hear the Gospel lesson of the Publican and the Pharisee; before we begin the season of self-denial, we recall that it is futile to boast of our abstinence. The Publican's model of humility and repentance be our aim.

On the next Sunday, we hear the story of the Prodigal Son, perhaps the most beloved parable. The icon of this scene shows the son in worn clothing, with his feet in rags; he cradles his sorry head in one hand, while stretching the other tentatively toward Jesus. There is nothing tentative about Jesus' response—he is running toward the son, his arms open to embrace, and a scroll tumbles from his hand: "For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found." Here we are being called to be reconciled with God.

By the third Sunday, we have reached a watershed. The Gospel reading focuses on the Last Judgment, and pulls no punches. Here we must examine our relationship with our brothers and sisters. How can we say we love God and despise our fellow human being? Our Lord is explicit when He tells us "What you have done (or not done) to the least of my brothers and sisters, you have done(or not done to me) visit the sick and imprisoned, clothe the naked, and feed the hungry." This day is also called "Meat-fare Sunday," the last day when meat is consumed.

The last Sunday of the Triodion is called "Cheese-fare Sunday," The tone of the day is centered around forgiveness. It is on this day we are reminded that if we want to experience the love and forgiveness of God, we must show that same spirit to our brothers and sisters. Forgiveness Sunday asks us to look within ourselves, and to really examine, to see if we are exiled from God.

Later that evening at the Vespers Service of Forgiveness we trade the bright chant melodies for more somber ones, the colorful vestments to the solemn purple, and pray the prayer of Ephrem the Syrian. The next day, Clean Monday we begin in totality the Great Fast.

BASIC GUIDELINES FOR RECEPTION OF THE HOLY COMMUNION

- 1. You are a member of the Catholic Church
- (Orthodox faithful are welcome to receive Communion);
- 2. You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently;
- 3. You attend Divine Services regularly;
- 4. Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church;
- 5. You have kept the Liturgical fast no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy. (water and medicine does not break the fast).
- 6. You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel.
- 7. To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace.

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.


WHAT IS A LENTEN SERVICE ...

... CANON OF ST. ANDREW?

The Great Canon of St Andrew, Bishop of Crete, is the longest canon in all of our services, and is associated with Great Lent, since the only times it is appointed to be read in church are the first four nights of Great Lent (Clean Monday through Clean Thursday, at Great Compline, when it is serialized) and at Matins for Thursday of the fifth week of Great Lent, when it is read in its entirety (in this latter service, the entire life of St Mary of Egypt is also read).

There is no other sacred hymn which compares with this monumental work, which St Andrew wrote for his personal meditations. Nothing else has its extensive typology and mystical explanations of the scripture, from both the Old and New Testaments. One can almost consider this hymn to be a "survey of the Old and New Testament". Its other distinguishing features are a spirit of mournful humility, hope in God, and complex and beautiful Trinitarian Doxologies and hymns to the Theotokos in each Ode.

The canon is a dialog between St. Andrew and his soul. The ongoing theme is an urgent exhortation to change one's life. St Andrew always mentions his own sinfulness placed in juxtaposition to God's mercy, and uses literally hundreds of references to good and bad examples from the OT and NT to "convince himself" to repent. The troparia of the Great Canon in all its twelve Odes are usually chanted by the priest in the center of the church, with the choir singing the Irmos and Katavasia. There are varying traditions about bows and prostrations. Some prostrate and some make the sign of the cross and bow three times after the Irmos and each troparion.
