Every Gospel narrative, just as word of the Gospel, everv conceals immeasurable meaning. Today's Gospel reading likewise speaks of eternal truths that are of great importance to our everyday lives. It speaks of the love of God for man and of the love of man for God: of the fact that God never leaves us without His merciful assistance. Whatever may befall us. God will never leave us in either trouble or woe – if only we remain with Him through our faith in Him, our love for Him, and our

fidelity to Him in our lives. We all resemble today's two blind men in our spiritual blindness – and not in this alone. We resemble these ailing people, who were tormented by their infirmities, in both our spiritual and bodily infirmities, which torment us as did theirs; and in that, like them, we continue to ask for things from the Lord: for the alleviation of suffering, for our healing, for the return of our health and the joy of life, which we have somehow lost. But, brethren, we do not always resemble them in their faith in the Lord and in His power. We do not resemble them in their fidelity to God, which is not as strong and undoubting as that of these two blind men. Is that not why we remain unhealed? The Lord Jesus Christ walked the earth very long ago, healing every infirmity and disease in people, just as He healed these two blind men of the Gospel who had unwavering faith in Him. Now, too, the Lord Jesus Christ heals all who have faith in Him throughout the entire world with that same Divine power, granting them peace, true joy, and salvation. Let us believe Him, as the two blind men believed Him. Let us, brethren, be faithful like them in our faith and love for Him.

#### > CCCB STATEMENT – DATE OF THE DELEGATION TO THE HOLY SEE

Tuesday, June 29, 2021

Following the 10 June 2021 announcement regarding the delegation of Indigenous people to meet with the Holy Father to foster meaningful encounters of dialogue and healing, the Catholic Bishops of Canada are pleased to announce that the delegation is scheduled to take place from 17-20 December 2021 in compliance with global travel restrictions.

Pope Francis is deeply committed to hearing directly from Indigenous Peoples, expressing his heartfelt closeness, addressing the impact of colonization and the role of the Church in the residential school system, in the hopes of responding to the suffering of Indigenous Peoples and the ongoing effects of intergenerational trauma. The Bishops of Canada are deeply appreciative of the Holy Father's spirit of openness in generously extending an invitation for personal encounters with each of the three distinct groups of delegates – First Nations, Métis and Inuit – as well as a final audience with all delegates together on 20 December 2021.

This pastoral visit will include the participation of a diverse group of Elders/Knowledge Keepers, residential school survivors and youth from across the country, accompanied by a small group of Bishops and Indigenous leaders. Planning for the delegation is ongoing and further details will be announced when they are available.

The Bishops of Canada reaffirm their sincere hope that these forthcoming encounters will lead to a shared future of peace and harmony between Indigenous Peoples and the Catholic Church in Canada.

➤ UNITY 2021 - Young Adult Gathering (18 - 35 years of age) With the blessing and support of the Rev. Bishop Bryan Bayda, the Eparchy of Toronto and Eastern Canada is excited to be hosting Unity 2021.

Unity is a gathering for young adults (18 - 35 years of age) of our church "who seek to further understand their Catholic Faith, to embrace it more fully and to celebrate it more profoundly. With the grace of God, this is accomplished by means of prayer, education and fellowship."

Unity 2021 is scheduled to take place Friday August 6 – Saturday August 7, 2021.

The theme of Unity 2021 is "Stillness In The Chaos" "Be still and know that I am God" Psalm 46:10 will be our motto for the weekend. This past year has been incredibly difficult for so many, and this topic is more important than ever. We will have sessions on:

- · Mental health,
- · Having a relationship with God,
- · What it means to be Ukrainian Catholic,
- · The Divine Liturgy,
- · Theology of the body and dating,
- · Wellness of Body, Mind and Spirit,
- · Evangelism and the leadership of Jesus Christ, and
- · Catholicism and non-traditional families.

Unity 2021 will be offered ONLINE, and all sessions will be held over Zoom. There is NO COST to attend this event.

Since our programming will be offered fully online this year, our planning committee felt it would be a unique opportunity to reach out and include fellow Ukrainian Catholics across North America. It truly will be a blessing to have all North American eparches represented at Unity 2021.

➤ LAY LEADERSHIP FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES - Interested in learning more about God, your faith, and the Church? Sign up for an online course (or two or three) or even work towards a Certificate in Eastern Christian Traditions at Newman Theological College (Edmonton).
