29 Sunday after Pentecost - Sunday of Holy Fore-Fathers 29 Неділя після П'ятидесятниці - Неділя Праотців DECEMBER 12, 2021

The **Sunday of the Holy Forefathers** is the Sunday that falls between December 11-17, the second Sunday before the Nativity. The ancestors of Christ according to the flesh are remembered on this Sunday of the Nativity Fast.

All the great Fathers and Mothers and Prophets of the Old Testament, starting with Adam, Abraham, the Righteous Sarah, Isaac and Jacob, including Holy Prophet Elias and Daniel, and concluding with Holy Prophet Zechariah (Zachary), Joachim and Anna, Holy Prophet and Forerunner John the Baptist and The Theotokos. They lived before the Law and under the Law, especially the Patriarch Abraham, to whom God said, "In thy seed shall all of the nations of the earth be blessed" (Genesis 12:3, 22:18)

The parable about the Great Banquet talks about a man who sent invitations for a special dinner party. The supper is not open to just anyone, but is by invitation only. What kinds of people do we invite to such parties? Usually we invite friends and family members who have invited us to their dinners. We also invite special guests who we feel particularly honored to have them in our homes. We feel some indebtedness to them when they grace us with their presence. Perhaps we want to impress others with who is willing to attend our dinners. The system of invitation to dinners becomes largely an exchange of paying off debts or indebting others to us. It is all mutually self-serving.

In our culture, parties and gift exchanges are often about maintaining a balance, everyone "owes" everyone else and you keep the peace and the balance by doing your part to equally pay back everyone else for their efforts. Everyone is held indebted to everyone else by the feelings of reciprocal payments. If we have a wedding, often the guest at least partially based on who invited us to their wedding.

Jesus challenges this system of social payback. Even sinners know enough to do this for their friends and family (Luke 6:32-34), but the Kingdom people are to live by the values of the Kingdom not the social values of this world. Just as Christ came to call the sick and sinners to Himself, we could do the same.

Кондак празника, глас 4: Вселенна сьогодні святкує зачаття Анни,* яке подав їй Бог,* бо вона породила ту,* що чудесно привела на світ Боже Слово.

Прокімен, глас 4: Благословенний ти, Господи Боже Отців наших, і хвальне і прославлене ім'я твоє на віки.

Стих: Бо праведний єси у всьому, що сотворив ти нам.

Апостол: До Колосян послання святого апостола Павла читання. (3: 4 - 11)

Brothers and Sisters! When Christ our life appears, then you shall appear with him in glory. Put to death whatever in your nature is rooted in earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desires, and that lust which is idolatry. These are the sins which provoke God's wrath. Your own conduct was once of this sort, when these sins were your very life. You must put that aside now: all the anger and guick temper, the malice, the insults, the foul language. Stop lying to one another. What you have done is put aside your old self with its past deeds and put on a new man, one who grows in knowledge as he is formed anew in the image of his Creator. There is no Greek or Jew here, circumcised or uncircumcised, foreigner Scythian, slave, or freeman. Rather, Christ is everything in all of you.

Alleluia Verses: Moses and Aaron were among his priests, and Samuel, among those who called upon his name.

They called upon the Lord, and he answered them.

Instead of 'It is truly right . . .': O my soul, extol the glorious conception* of the Mother of God.* You are an inexhaustible source of life,* O Mother of God.* You are a radiant lamp of grace, a temple of the Holy Spirit,* an all-pure tent more spacious* than the heavens and the earth.* Therefore, we the faithful,* praise you.

Communion Hymn: Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest.

Over the last few weeks, we have all seen the news with images of the devastating effect on the lives and livelihood of so many people in British Columbia due to recent torrential rains, floods and landslides. Catechism of the Ukrainian Catholic Church – "Christ Our Pascha" #756-758, p. 246-7 1. Sin in Human Life

756 Having been created by God, human beings are called to grow into the freedom of the children of God (see Rom 8:21). But they have not always been faithful to this vocation. Adam and Eve, having succumbed to deception, rejected God's will and thus weakened their ability to exercise the gift of freedom. Christian tradition refers to this refusal to obey God as sin. Having sinned, humanity placed itself in an unnatural condition: separation from God and alienation from neighbours.

757 Christian tradition regards sin as an illness, which distorts one's divine image. In one of the troparia of the Parastas service, we sing, "I am the image of your ineffable glory, though I bear the brands of transgressions." Therefore, a sinful person does not so much deserve condemnation as require healing—God's mercy and forgiveness. Thus, a sinner is ill and Christ is the physician. "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick" (Mt 9:12).

758 Sin is, first of all, a person's state that manifests itself in actions, and a sinful deed is the conscious and voluntary violation of God's commandment. Violation of even one of God's commandments is a violation of all of God's Law. "For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable [guilty] for all of it. For he who said, 'You shall not commit adultery,' also said, 'You shall not murder.' Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law" (Jas 2:10-11). As one illness can cause another, so one sin leads to another. Saint John of Damascus emphasizes that there are eight evil "thoughts" (in Greek, logismoi), that give rise to sin: gluttony, lust, avarice (love of money), melancholy, anger, acedia (despondency), vainglory, and pride 468 We call them the capital sins as they are the root of all other sinful acts

Keep those who are good in goodness. In your kindness, make those who are wicked good... bring back the wayward. (Anaphora from the Liturgy of Saint Basil the Great)
